

Plant City Fertilizer Facility Closure

Here's what you need to know.



THREE STEPS FOR CLOSURE

While operations may have ended at our Plant City facility, Mosaic is still a responsible, active member of the community. We remain committed to sharing important information about our future plans, keeping our neighbors updated, and continuing support of several long-time community partners including the Strawberry Festival, local youth 4H/FFA programs, and the United Food Bank of Plant City.

STEP 1

Decommissioning Begins

Decommissioning started this summer. The multi-phase project is focused on reducing Environmental, Health & Safety risks often associated with retired assets. The project includes disconnecting and rerouting utilities to support ongoing water management as our team also remains hard at work completing closure of the phosphogypsum stack on site. The physical demolition is expected to continue through 2026 with stack closure taking longer, each in accordance with state and federal laws.

STEP 2

Water Management

We are increasing water treatment capacity to reduce the site's process water inventory while implementing an innovative design to accelerate the conversion of slopes and ponds into grassed areas. Additionally, we will continue closing off slopes to prevent rainwater from entering the stack ponds, further enhancing water management.

STEP 3

Maintain Communication

Our commitment to continuing our environmental monitoring and reporting efforts and ensuring site conditions are consistently communicated to local and state regulators remains our top priority. Routine inspections with regulatory agencies will be maintained as part of the standard environmental oversight we follow at each of our operations across the Tampa Bay region. And through it all, we pledge to stay in touch with you, our neighbors, as we have throughout the decades we have lived and worked in the Plant City community.
